## If you like making a difference in people's lives, you may like the wide array of jobs in health care.

Health care hired 3,600 people in 2019. Over the last 10 years, it has been the region's fastest-growing sector and is expected to continue to expand rapidly—18 percent—over the next eight years. No other sector has so many in-demand jobs.

Health care jobs range from entry-level positions that require only a little training beyond high school through medical doctors with years of schooling and internships. Below are the three largest health care occupations. Other occupations in high demand include: dental assistants, medical assistants, medical secretaries & administrative assistants, dental hygienists, radiologic technologists & technicians, phlebotomists, physical therapists, billing & posting clerks, physical therapist assistants, nurse practitioners, surgical technologists, pharmacy technicians, respiratory therapists, speech-language pathologists, physician assistants, occupational therapists, and dentists


