- -- Prominent sub-industries include Small Arms Ammunition, Pulp/Paper/Paperboard Mills, Sawmills/Other Wood, Aluminum Jetboat Manufacturing, Electrical Equipment Manufacturing, and Machinery Manufacturing
- -- Between 2010-2023, manufacturing employment increased by 1000+ positions and is expected to add approximately 400 additonal positions in North Central Idaho through 2032
